

RETURN TO SCHOOL QUESTIONNAIRE

1. Has the child been fever free for 24 hours without use of fever reducing medication?

2. Were they seen by a doctor or other healthcare provider?

3. Was any testing done? (i.e. strep, flu or COVID) If so, what was the result?

4. Was the student prescribed antibiotics? If so, has he/she been on the medication for 24 hours?

5. Has there been a significant improvement in symptoms?

Has any member of the household had a positive COVID test in the last 2 weeks or do they have a test pending? (Circle One) YES NO

If you answered YES to the question above, the student is not to return to school for 2 weeks from the date on which the household case was released from isolation or until after a pending case comes back negative.

If your child is still experiencing significant symptoms even without fever please keep them home and consider evaluation by your medical provider.

SECTION 1: Presenting symptoms:

- Fever of 100.4 or higher**
- Chills/ Fatigue**
- Sore Throat**

- New uncontrolled cough that causes difficulty breathing (for students with chronic allergic/asthmatic cough, a change in their cough from baseline)**
- Diarrhea**
- Vomiting**
- New onset of severe headache, especially with a fever**

**If coughing, does the student have asthma? If so, follow his/her asthma action plan. If a student is having difficulty breathing or shortness of breath and has no history of asthma call 911.*

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SECTION 3: Returning to School

- Students sent home with a fever (100.4 or greater), cannot return to school for a minimum of thirty-six (36) hours **AND** must be fever free, without fever reducing medications **AND** not have developed any other symptoms .
- Students sent home with fever of 100.4 degrees and combination of two (2) other symptoms (listed in Section 1 Above), or a combination of three (3) symptoms can return to school after a minimum of ten (10) days of absence **AND** twenty-four (24) hours fever free (without fever reducing medications) **AND** significant improvements in symptoms, **requiring a MD note to return to school.**
